Mrs. Priya Rao, addressed MPBIM students during the awareness campaign on Neuro-Muscular and Developmental Disabilities like Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Mental Retardation, Multiple Disabilities and Learning Disabilities.

Ms. Priya Rao during her presentation on the subject introduced students to **The Spastics Society of Karnataka**, a Non-Government Organisation (NGO) dedicated to the welfare of persons with Neuro-Muscular and Developmental Disabilities.
